ROUNDHOUSE DAY TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Review the agenda and know when and where you are to be.
- Review all provided handouts so that you are prepared to visit with your legislators.
- Research your legislators.
- Be positive.
- Be honest. Answer all questions candidly and as truthfully as possible. If you don't know an answer, indicate a willingness to find out and get back with the answer. Do not make up an answer.
- Be a strong and articulate advocate for 4-H.
- Thanks officials for their support.
- Thank staff and members of the legislature for their time.
- Remember you are representing you county and state.
- Members should bring one colored copy of their prepared handout "4-H Grows. . ." with them to registration.

ROUNDHOUSE DAY APPEARANCE AND DRESS

- All delegates and chaperones are expected to be professional while participating in 4-H Day at the Roundhouse. Professionalism includes appearance, etiquette, and presentation.
- Grooming cannot be overemphasized. Good grooming refers to the total package of general cleanliness and neatness—hair, make-up, clean shaven, nails and small professional accessories.
- Clothes should be clean and not in need of repair; free of stain and lint; well pressed/ironed; and shoes clean and polished.
- State Leadership Team members (Officers, State Diplomats and State 4-H Ambassadors) are to wear full dress uniform.
- All other youth and adult representatives will wear dress shirts (4-H polos are appropriate **No T-shirts**) and pants or skirts. Your outfit should be complete with leather shoes or boots and a belt.
- Athletic shoes or hats are not to be worn by Roundhouse Day participants or accompanying adults at any time during the event.
- If wearing a skirt or dress, you should wear hose or tights with a knee length or longer skirt.
- Chaperones are expected to wear business professional dress.
- Wear comfortable and well broken-in professional shoes. You will be on your feet and may have to walk quickly between appointments.

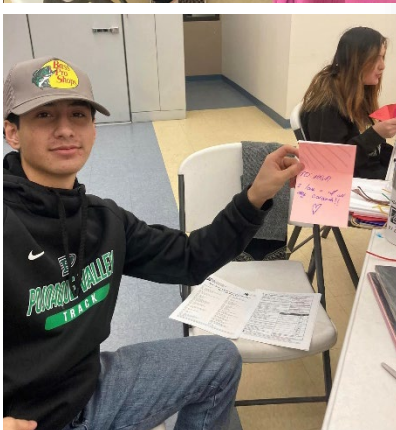
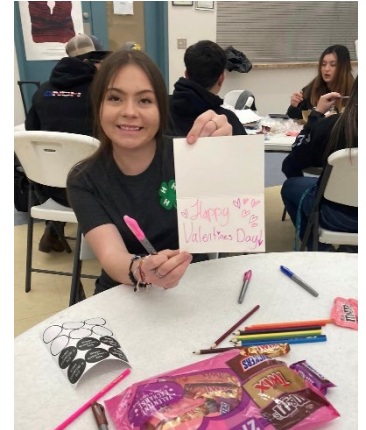

The online portion will cover items including history, introduction to 4-H shooting sports, creating high quality programs, and risk management and is now available online through Zing-books at a cost of \$20.00 to access that portion of the training.

The training in Alamogordo, NM will begin Saturday at 8:00 am, February 25th, and conclude on Sunday February 26th. Time to Complete the Annual Working with Minor Training **Guidelines for 4-H Volunteers**

You may complete the training through the Self-paced model on Zsutes: <https://4h.zsuite.org/>

When you are in your 4H ZSuite account and have selected your profile follow the steps below:

1. Click on Clover Academy on the left menu bar
2. Launch Clover Academy
3. Open NM Working with Minors (*even though it says completed*)
4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says *[Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)]*
5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
6. Start Course
7. Complete the course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H ZSuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.

Just a reminder, all of us that work directly with youth need to take the working with minors training annually.
