
Meet the Staff

Prizes are awarded to the top 4 teams overall and to the top 10 individuals in each age division (Novice, Jr., Sr.). Matches are held over Zoom, so you can compete virtually with teams across the state. You don't need to be in the horse project, but you must be enrolled in New Mexico 4-H to play. The registration fee is \$10 per contestant.

<u>Registration opens January 6 and closes on January 16, 2025.</u> You can register through your county 4-H agent. Your agent can provide study materials, tournament rules, and technology requirements. Time to Complete the Annual Working with Minor Training Guidelines for 4-H Volunteers

You may complete the training through the Self-paced model on Zsuites:

https://4h.zsuite.org/

When you are in your 4H ZSuite account and have selected your profile follow the steps below:

- 1. Click on Clover Academy on the left menu bar
- 2. Launch Clover Academy
- 3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)

4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says [Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)]

5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'

6. Start Course

7. Complete the course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H ZSuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page. *Just a reminder, all of us that work directly with youth need to take the working with minors training annually.*

New Mexico 4–H Community Service Scholarships

If a youth is interested in attending one of the annual events and are looking for a way to assist with registration costs they can apply for the New Mexico 4-H Community Service Scholarship. The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, State 4-H Conference, 4-H International Exchange, FCS School, 4-H Dog School or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador.

The applicant can create their own community service or if they would like to work with an organization in creating a new program that is acceptable. The project must be an activity that the youth designs, organizes and implements that will have an impact on the community.

Scholarship Applications for the events are due two months before the event registration deadline.

If the applicant submitted a scholarship application for an event and received the scholarship, they need to have their community service report complete and submitted to the State 4-H Office before they can apply for the community service scholarship for any future events. The community service can be completed within a year of approval.
