




New Mexico 4-H

Who: NM 4-H is **THE** youth program of the NM Cooperative Extension Service. It is open to youth from 5-19 with age appropriate programing. The 4-H program is supervised by the County Extension Agent and led by 4-H volunteers.

How: Delivery modes of 4-H include club, special interest and school enrichment.

Club: A 4-H Club is an organized group of at least five youth from at least three different families who meet regularly with adult volunteers or staff for a long-term, progressive series of educational experiences. It can be in school, after school, in the community or associated with a military instillation with a planned program.

Special Interest: The special interest program must consist of planned educational objectives with a minimum of six contact hours.

School Enrichment: 4- H School Enrichment groups focus on a subject matter topic and are established if school administration and the classroom teacher are supportive.

Constitution Article IV - Officers

The elected officers known as the executive committee of the Rio Arriba County 4-H Council shall consist of:

- 1. President
- 2. Vice President
- 3. Secretary
- 4. Treasurer
- 5. Four (4) County 4-H Ambassadors

By-Laws Article I – Election of Officers

- Officers shall be elected at the December meeting and installed at the Annual Awards Ceremony.
- Term of office shall be one year.
- Officers are not eligible to succeed themselves in the same office.
- If officers miss two (2) regular meetings or other council planned activities, they will be reviewed by the council and may be automatically removed from office. The council will vote in replacement officers from qualified council delegates.
- Voting will be by secret ballot. In case of a tie, a coin will be tossed.
- Candidates should be present at the election meeting.

Article IV - Qualifications of Officers

- The office of President should be held by a senior 4-H member who has held an office in his/her local club.
- The offices of President and Secretary should be held by members who have been in 4-H for at least two (2) years.
- The offices of Vice President, Treasurer, Reporter, Recreation Leader, Historian and Parliamentarian should be held by members who have been in 4-H at least one (1) year.
- The officer candidates should be aware of the importance of community (i.e., may have taken 4-H junior leadership projects and know duties of offices).

By Laws Article V – Duties of Officers

General duties of all officers of the Rio Arriba County 4-H Council are:

- Attend officer training (usually held in January or February).
- Keep log of duties performed and submit report at end of the year.
- Attend officer meetings as called to handle immediate matters of the council.
- Provide reports prior to regular meetings, and a letter of explanation for missed meetings.
- Train officers in each county club as requested.

President:

- Preside over all regular and special meetings.
- Represent the 4-H Council at all meetings requiring such representation (i.e., Fair Board, Advisory committee, community gatherings, etc.).
- Appoint committees.
- Be familiar with Robert's Rules of Order. Vice President:
- Act in the absence of the President.
- Assist with committees as designated by the President.

Vice President:

Act in the absence of the President.

Assist with committees as designated by the President.

Secretary:

- Keeps an accurate record of procedures of all meetings, regular and special.
- Submit minutes to the County Extension Office no more than two weeks following a meeting.
- At each meeting, stand and read the minutes of the last meeting. Make corrections listed by council members
- Read correspondence. Reply as indicated by council.

Treasurer:

- Receive, hold, and distribute funds belonging to the Rio Arriba County 4-H Council.
- Give a financial report when called for by the President and at every meeting.
- Produce and audit the books annually.
- Shall be one of two signatories (Treasurer and Council Advisor) on all checks.
- Treasurer will submit a written treasurer's report to the County Extension staff at each county council meeting.

Reporter: Ambassador duties will include identifying 4-H project and program area to promote and assisting in planning and conducting 4-H events in conjunction with the officers and reporting them to the Extension office, for publication in the Cloverleaf.

- Will be in contact with the secretary after each meeting to write newspaper articles and assist in preparing advertising material for events, seeing sufficient publicity is given to the activities of the council utilizing newspaper, radio, and other media
- Maintain a scrapbook and photo file of all 4-H council activities. Scrapbook may contain minutes, treasurer reports, news articles of council activities, photos, and event reports.
- Encourage participation from Club to contribute to council meetings and other events. (Note: Council officer handbooks will be provided by the County Extension staff annually).

To run for office please email Joy & Iliana at: jczmyrid@nmsu.edu; mendezi@nmsu.edu, be approved by the county and submitted to the Extension office by November 29th. Candidates must complete email us to be eligible for nomination. Additionally, nominations of the approved applicants will be made from the floor by during the annual meeting.

Any qualified candidate who has been defeated in the voting in any previous office is eligible to be re-nominated for any remaining office. A candidate is any member who has been nominated in the nominating session of the meeting. Officers will be elected in the following order: president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, county 4-H ambassador.

Cost

\$130.00 per person for 4-H'ers and adults (conference t-shirt, lunch and dinner on Saturday, workshops, facility rentals and program expenses included). Counties will need to arrange and cover their own lodging, dinner on Friday, and breakfasts.

Lodging

A list of hotels with 4-H blocks will be provided in the full registration. Counties can chose to make reservations at one of those hotels or coordinate their own.

Registration deadlines

Counties set their own registration deadlines. State 4-H Registration for Counties: December 15

Forms

- NM 4-H Medical/Liability Release Form Must have one turned into your County Extension Office by the county registration deadline.
- Forms sent in must have signatures. If the signature is electronic, the fourth page showing the signature must be included.

Chaperones

Adults serving as chaperones for a county must be enrolled in the 4-H program. If not enrolled, they cannot serve as a chaperone. Please make sure they are enrolled before registering them.

Cancellations and Refunds

- ★ Cancellations and refunds are made only if road conditions in the <u>Las Cruces</u> vicinity are severe. Drivers must make their own travel decisions based on road conditions in their area. We do not want anybody taking unnecessary risks in order to attend this event.
- **★** Refunds cannot be made unless there is a National Weather Service storm warning in existence in the Las Cruces/Dona Ana area.
- ★ If a refund is made due to bad weather, there will be a surcharge deducted to cover actual program expenses incurred up to that point.
- ★ If a cancellation is made prior to the registration deadline, the participant can receive a full refund.
- ★ After registration is closed, if a 4-H'er or adult who is registered cannot attend, a county can substitute another person of the same sex in his or her place, but an actual refund will not be made. If there is no one from your county to fill the spot, please let the state office know before sharing the vacant spot with counties.
- ★ If a cancellation is done after registration is closed due to an emergency or current health issue a full refund will be given to the participant.



Time to Complete the Annual Working with Minor Training Guidelines for 4-H Volunteers

You may complete the training through the Self-paced model on Zsuites: https://4h.zsuite.org/

When you are in your 4H ZSuite account and have selected your profile follow the steps below:

- 1. Click on Clover Academy on the left menu bar
- 2. Launch Clover Academy
- 3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
- 4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says [Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)]
- 5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
- 6. Start Course
- 7. Complete the course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H ZSuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.
