Enrolled in a Livestock 4-H Project?

Planning to Exhibit your 4-H Project Animal?

Livestock exhibitors are required to attend the designated tagging dates and to complete a Livestock Nomination Certificate to designate their project animals. 4-H Leaders and FFA advisors will be asked to sign the completed certificates after the tagging to complete the nomination process. In the months leading up to the County Fair, exhibitors will be asked to complete an entry form confirming show intentions and identifying the number of livestock pens needed.

Keep in Mind:

NO animals will be tagged outside of specified dates or off site.

Exhibitor need not be present at tagging, as long as, proper paperwork is completed and sent with designated representative.

Tags will cost \$3.50 ment pricing: 1st replacement

Tag Replacement pricing: 1st replacement \$3.50; 2nd and beyond \$4.

Enrolled in a 4-H Horse Project?

Members looking to participate in 4-H Sanctioned Horse Shows are required to submit a Horse Certificate for their 4-H project horse. Horse Certificates need to be completed every year. Horse Certificates are due on **May 1** to the **County Extension**Office and available on our County Website

Enrolled in the 4-H Rodeo Project?

By State Rodeo Rules, all contestants must have personal accident insurance and a signed and completed rodeo waiver in the State 4-H Office 15 days prior to the participant's first rodeo of the current year in order for the member to compete in Sanctioned 4-H Rodeos.

This includes the completion of the rodeo safety course.

If hauling, obtain hauling certificate.

Have you completed the model in past years? Here are the steps to complete the training for this year:

- 1. Click on Clover Academy on left menu bar
- 2. Launch Clover Academy
- 3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
- 4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says[Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)]
- 5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
- 6. Start Course
- Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.

As part of the in-person training, participants must complete the Shooting Sports College module found at: www.4-hshootingsportscollege.com.

The on-line portion will cover items over history, introduction to 4-H shooting sports, creating high quality programs, and risk management. The Online portion is through Zing-books and will cost \$20.00 to access.

REGISTRATION FEE FOR IN-PERSON CERTIFICATION IS \$60.00 (Not including on-line portion).

Registration and payment for the In-person Certification is DUE BY February 7, 2022.

Leaders must be approved screened 4-H volunteers to be eligible to register for the certification.



HOW TO MAKE A MOTION

Let the President know you would like to make a Motion. Wait until the President calls on you and then begin by stating..." After the main Motion is made, it must receive a second, to support the action. This is done by having a member stand and state..." I second the motion." President: "It has been properly moved and seconded that we... Is there any discussion?" Discussion allows for reasons for supporting or opposing the motion to the group. When discussion ends, the President calls for a vote of the members at the meeting. President: "We will now proceed to vote. All those in favor of the main motion, signify by saying "Aye." All those opposed say, "Nay." If a majority of the members support the motion...President: "Motion passes." If the majority are opposed...President "Motion fails." President taps the gavel.














We are very sad to hear about the passing of Jose Archuleta. Jose was one of our first Young Guns 4-H members. Jose was a very active 4-H member. Jose held several club positions such as treasurer, vice president and president. Jose's club projects included raising steers, heifers, hogs, goats and welding.
