Below is information taken from the Rio Arriba Council Constitution and By-Laws.

Constitution Article IV - Officers

The elected officers known as the executive committee of the Rio Arriba County 4-H Council shall consist of:

- 1. President
- 2. Vice President
- 3. Secretary
- 4. Treasurer
- 5. Four (4) County 4-H Ambassadors

By-Laws Article I – Election of Officers

- Officers shall be elected at the October meeting and installed at the Annual Awards Ceremony.
- Term of office shall be one year.
- Officers are not eligible to succeed themselves in the same office.
- If officers miss two (2) regular meetings or other council planned activities, they will be reviewed by the council and may be automatically removed from office. The council will vote in replacement officers from qualified council delegates.
- Voting will be by secret ballot. In case of a tie, a coin will be tossed.
- Candidates should be present at the election meeting.

Article IV - Qualifications of Officers

- The office of President should be held by a senior 4-H member who has held an office in his/her local club.
- The President and Vice President should not both be seniors in High School.
- The offices of President and Secretary should be held by members who have been in 4-H for at least two (2) years.
- The offices of Vice President, Treasurer, Reporter, Recreation Leader, Historian and Parliamentarian should be held by members who have been in 4-H at least one (1) year.
- The officer candidates should be aware of the importance of community (i.e., may have taken 4-H junior leadership projects and know duties of offices).

By Laws Article V - Duties of Officers

General duties of all officers of the Rio Arriba County 4-H Council are:

- Attend officer training (usually held in January or February).
- Keep log of duties performed and submit report at end of the year.
- Attend officer meetings as called to handle immediate matters of the council.
- Provide reports prior to regular meetings, and a letter of explanation for missed meetin
- Train officers in each county club as requested.

HOW TO MAKE A MOTION

Let the President know you would like to make a Motion. Wait until the President calls on you and then begin by stating..."I move..." After the main Motion is made, it must receive a second, to support the action. This is done by having a member stand and state..."I second the motion." President: "It has been properly moved and seconded that we... Is there any discussion?" Discussion allows for reasons for supporting or opposing the motion to the group. When discussion ends, the President calls for a vote of the members at the meeting. President: "We will now proceed to vote. All those in favor of the main motion, signify by saying "Aye." All those opposed say, "Nay."

How To Participate

For all Extension professionals between the ages of 18–65, <u>please complete this survey (link also below)</u>. The survey will be open until December 22 and should take approximately 10 minutes to complete.

Agricultural literacy is defined as an individual's ability to value and communicate accurately about agriculture. It is a critical component of the extension mission—and a topic area that has significance to nearly every program area. Agriculture is more than food, clothing, and shelter. It is a part of finance, nutrition, community employment, youth programs, environmental sustainability, and more. Participation is voluntary, but the survey will offer data that will enable us to determine a baseline for the level of agricultural knowledge held within the front lines of our organization.

How To Win

Participation is voluntary and your survey results will be anonymous. For those who complete the survey, you will be directed to a separate Google form where you will enter your contact information for a chance to win one of three "swag gift baskets." Two "Aggie swag" baskets are worth \$100, and one "Aggie swag" basket is worth \$50. At the end of the survey period, three winners will be randomly selected, and the winners will be notified at the end of the survey period. Portfolio is another word for a record book that covers your entire career in 4-H, as opposed to only one year. Not only will you have a comprehensive record of your 4-H activities and gain the valuable skills, you have an opportunity to compete for a sponsored trip to the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia. This opportunity is available to Senior 4-H members (age 13 and in the 8th grade – age 18). There is no minimum number of years you have to have been a member or submitted a county record book. 

It is a requirement to have your project animals tagged and inspected during designated dates in order to exhibit at the Rio Arriba County Fair, which will be held July 27-31, 2022.

Beef:

Friday, February 25, Tierra Amarilla, 3-5 pm Saturday, February 26, Abiquiu, 9-11 am

Goat, Sheep, and Swine:

Friday, April 29, Tierra Amarilla, 3-6 pm Saturday, April 30, Abiquiu, 9-11 am

Rabbits and Poultry:

Friday, June 24th, Tierra Amarilla, 3-6 pm Saturday, June 25th, Abiquiu Office, 9-11 am

Enrolled in a Livestock 4-H Project?

Planning to Exhibit your 4-H Project Animal?

Livestock exhibitors are required to attend the designated tagging dates and to complete a Livestock Nomination Certificate to designate their project animals. 4-H Leaders and FFA advisors will be asked to sign the completed certificates after the tagging to complete the nomination process. In the months leading up to the County Fair, exhibitors will be asked to complete an entry form confirming show intentions and identifying the number of livestock pens needed.

NO animals will be tagged outside of specified dates or off site.

Exhibitor need not be present at tagging, as long as, proper paperwork is completed and sent with designated representative.

Tags will cost \$3.50

Tag Replacement pricing: 1st replacement \$3.50; 2nd and beyond \$4.

Enrolled in a 4-H Horse Project?

Members looking to participate in 4-H Sanctioned Horse Shows are required to submit a Horse Certificate for their 4-H project horse. Horse Certificates need to be completed every year. Horse Certificates are due on **May 1** to the **County Extension Office** and available on our County Website

Enrolled in the 4-H Rodeo Project?

By State Rodeo Rules, all contestants must have personal accident insurance and a signed and completed rodeo waiver in the State 4-H Office 15 days prior to the participant's first rodeo of the current year in order for the member to compete in Sanctioned 4-H Rodeos.

This includes the completion of the rodeo safety course.

If hauling, obtain hauling certificate.

- 3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
- 4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says[Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)]
- 5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'
- 6. Start Course
- Complete course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. The county 4-H Zsuite administrator should be able to see the volunteer completion on his/her county page.
