

Turn the kite over and tape across the fold of one end. Tape the drinking straw across the other end.

Punch a hole
through the

paper.


Push the end of your thread through the hole and tie three or four knots to hold the thread.


Tape colorful streamers to the bottom of your kite and you're




Steer Clear With hamel Signeds.


According to the law, a bicycle rider must use the left arm to signal when turning or stopping.

Walking Paper Horse Template

This page makes three (3) horses.

- 1. Cut out the three rectangle shapes
- 2. Cut along dotted lines to create the legs, head and tail, then cut along dotted line of each leg.
- 3. Fold down legs on blue line, and then fold up head and tail on blue line.
- 4. Cut on dotted lines to make ears and a nose, then fold tabs up to make ears. For best results, use construction paper or cardstock.
